Juvenile Assessment Center July - September 2011

Introduction

This is the first quarterly report for the year 2011-2012 for juveniles that have been assessed throughout the components of the Juvenile Assessment Center, including Civil Citation and Juvenile Drug Court.

This quarter the booking/intake unit of the JAC booked and screened three hundred and fifty-one (351) juveniles. This is a decrease from the previous quarter in which four hundred and thirty-one (431) were screened. Civil Citation had a decrease from sixty-eight (68) citations issued in the last quarter to fifty-five (55) during this quarter. Some of the decrease in referrals is attributed to the summer break for the local school system.

The Drug Court program continues to serve youth in Leon, Gadsden and Wakulla Counties.

Booking/Assessment

Three hundred and fifty-one (351) intake screenings have been completed through the Booking/Assessment unit this quarter. This is a decrease from the last quarter when four hundred and thirty-one (431) youth were booked and screened.

Follow ups were completed on JAC clients that were referred to the JAC in July, August, and September 2010. The data reflected that twenty-two percent (22%) of clients referred from July 2010 recidivated; twenty-one percent (21%) from August 2010 recidivated; and twenty-two percent (22%) from September 2010 recidivated as of when data was finalized on October 1, 2011. This data shows a twenty-two percent (22%) recidivism rate for juveniles that came through the JAC a year ago during the same reporting quarter. (Please refer to Table 1).

The majority of youth served during this quarter have been for males at two hundred and thirty-eight (238) or sixty-eight percent (68%). Sixty-seven percent (67%) of offenders this quarter were African-American and thirty-one percent (31%) Caucasian. The most frequent age cohort was 16 - 18 year olds at sixty-two percent (62%) for the quarter and 12-15 year olds at thirty-six percent (36%) for the quarter. (Please refer to Table 2).

The majority of youth arrested this quarter, at fifty-three percent (53%), have been for misdemeanors. Forty-four percent (44%) of juveniles brought to the Booking/Intake unit this quarter were arrested on felony charges and thirty-three percent (33%) were arrested for Pick Up Orders, Warrants, and Violations. (Please note that a youth can be brought in to the JAC on multiple offenses.)

The majority of youth this quarter were transported to the Juvenile Detention Center at fifty-nine percent (59%) while seventeen percent (17%) were released to their parents/guardians. (Please refer to Table 3).

During the quarter, thirty-two (32) urinalysis screens were conducted. Of that amount, forty-four percent (44%) were negative and eighty-three percent (83%) were positive for Cannabis. The urinalysis screens at the JAC are voluntary and the majority of the youth coming through the JAC are familiar with the system and refuse to be screened. (Client may test positive for more than one substance). (Please refer to Table 5).

Booking & Assessment Highlights

- ◆ Juveniles charged with a crime of petit theft accounted for a total of twelve percent (12%) of misdemeanor arrests during this quarter, with total misdemeanors at fifty-three percent (53%) and felonies at forty-four percent (44%).
- ◆ Thirteen (13) weapons were confiscated from juveniles by law enforcement this quarter prior to being brought to the JAC. Weapons confiscated included: seven (7) guns, two (2) knives, and four (4) miscellaneous weapons.
- ◆ Arrests where drugs were involved (possession, paraphernalia, intent to sell, etc.) accounted for thirteen percent (13%) of all arrests this quarter; misdemeanors at two percent (2%) and felonies at eleven percent (11%).
- ◆ During the quarter seven (7) youth were disposed to the Juvenile Drug Court program. During the quarter there were seventy-seven (77) referrals made to the Juvenile Outpatient program. Information regarding the Multidisciplinary Staffing recommendations will be available in the second quarter report.
- ◆ Data regarding out of county law enforcement contacts are now being tracked as well as youth that are screened at the JAC requiring a Gang Member Validation Form. During the first quarter there were thirty-two (32) calls to the JAC from law enforcement agencies outside of Leon County. Also, during the first quarter there was one (1) youth that required a gang validation form to be completed.

Civil Citation

Fifty-five (55) citations have been issued during the first quarter. This is a decrease in thirteen (13) referrals from the last quarter's report. The Tallahassee Police Department issued forty-five percent (45%), the Leon County Sheriff's Department issued fifty percent (50%), FSU Police Department issued five percent (5%) and the Game and Fish Commission issued zero percent (0%).

The majority of youth issued civil citations this quarter have been for males at sixty-five percent (65%). Referrals by race showed Caucasians at forty-four percent (44%) and African-Americans at fifty-one percent (51%). The most prevalent age group was youth between sixteen to eighteen (16-18) years old at fifty-eight percent (58%) (Please refer to Table 6).

There were nineteen (19) referrals to the Y.E.S. Shoplifting program this quarter. Other data for the Civil Citation program showed that of the thirteen (13) urinalyses tests completed this quarter, and out of those positive one hundred percent (100%) were positive for Cannabis.

DISC Village, Inc. has partnered with the Wakulla County Civil Citation program and is providing services to their clients through the Teen Intervene program. During the first quarter the program has referred five (5) out of their eight (8) clients to Teen Intervene.

Civil Citation Highlights

- ◆ Eighty-three percent (83%) of citations have been closed successfully this quarter. Five percent (5%) have been closed unsuccessful, Nine percent (9%) were ineligible for the program and three percent (3%) were withdrawn by the referral source.
- ◆ Community referrals accounted for eighty percent (80%) of the referrals this quarter and school referrals accounted for twenty percent (20%).
- ◆ Civil Citation clients completed two thousand and sixty-four (2,064) community service hours this quarter. The number of community service performed is determined by the amount of hours being assigned by law enforcement officers issuing citations.
- ◆ Quarterly awards are given to the officers/deputies that issue the most citations during the quarter. The officers/deputies receive a framed certificate, a gift certificate and their name engraved on a plaque. The awards this quarter go to Officers Jason Newhouse, with the Tallahassee Police Department and Deputy Dean Crump, with the Leon County Sheriff's Office.

Juvenile Drug Court

One hundred and thirty-nine (139) juveniles were served in Juvenile Drug Court during the quarter. Twenty-seven (27) juveniles were newly referred to the Juvenile Drug Court during the quarter. Of those twenty-seven (27) newly enrolled in the program, eighty-five percent (85%) were male and fifteen percent (15%) were female. Forty-eight percent (48%) of clients served were Caucasian, forty-four percent (44%) were African/American, seven percent (7%) were Hispanic and zero percent (0%) were other.

The most common age cohort of newly enrolled clients was 16-18 year olds at eighty-one percent (81%). The primary reason for referral was Other at fifty-five percent (55%) followed by Possession Cannabis Less Than 20 Grams at twenty-one percent (21%). Note that youth can have more than one reason for referral. (Please refer to Table 8).

During the quarter, one thousand six hundred and eleven (1,611) urinalysis screenings were conducted. Of that amount, eighty-one percent (81%) were negative, twelve percent (12%) were positive for Cannabis and eleven percent (11%) was positive for Alcohol. (Client may test positive for more than one substance). (Please refer to Table 9).

Juvenile Drug Court Highlights

- ◆ There were thirty-six (36) closures this quarter, of which thirty-three (33) or ninety-one percent (91%) were closed successful. Three (3) clients or eight percent (8%) were closed unsuccessful and one (1) client or three percent (3%) were transferred to another program.
- ◆ The first quarter of this fiscal year sees the program serving one more client at this time last year (28/27).
- ◆ The program continues to work with each youth and their family individually to serve their needs. The participants and their families are provided a setting to work on the issues that brought them to this stage in their lives. The program offers an opportunity to help the participants regain the trust of their family, establish familial boundaries, build educational and vocational goals, make positive peer choices, engage in positive activities within their communities and help the participants see the effects that substance use has on their lives and those around them.
- ◆ The participants of the program continue to engage in community projects this quarter. This summer they paired with our Wakulla County program that serves foster care clients and bought tote bags with school supplies for the program clients. Currently they are bringing in can goods for the Fall Food Drive for the Second Harvest of the Big Bend. The girl's group has started a project to paint murals for our office lobby which will allow them to leave a positive message for other clients to view.

Case Study

First Quarter 2011-2012

On August 4, 2011, Christopher Johnson was referred to the Juvenile Assessment Center (JAC) by the Tallahassee Police Department for Criminal Mischief. The youth is currently under the supervision of Katherine Fisher of the Henry and Rilla White Foundation in Circuit 2.

Once the youth arrived to the JAC, the youth was pre-screened by the on-duty Correctional Officer to determine if admittance was appropriate. The youth was admitted and was booked by the Correctional Officer. Next, the on-duty Screener conducted a diligent search to locate the youth's profile in the Juvenile Justice Information Systems Database. The profile was found and reviewed to determine accuracy. The youth was then screened and the Global Appraisal of Individual Needs (GAIN) assessment was conducted in collaboration with the Positive Achievement Change Tool (PACT). Both assessments along with parental input revealed that the youth suffers from mental health issues and currently suicidal. All information captured in the screening was noted and forwarded to the JAC multi-disciplinary Case Staffing team.

Based on the outcome of the Detention Risk Assessment Instrument (DRAI), the youth was transported to the Leon Regional Juvenile Detention Center pending a Detention Hearing on August 5, 2011 at the Leon County Courthouse. Honorable Judge Gievers remanded the youth in secure detainment until the Hastings Comprehensive Mental Health Treatment Facility accepted the youth on October 11, 2011. While at the Hastings program, the youth will receive vocational rehabilitation as well as other treatment services. The youth currently has \$1000 of restitution fees. Upon his successful release from Hastings, he will participate in the Project Payback program to assist in paying his restitution.

CIVIL CITATION
Case Study
First Quarter 2011-2012

On August 17, 2011 a sixteen-year-old Caucasian female completed an intake assessment with the Civil Citation Program. The Tallahassee Police Department referred the client to the program due to a Retail Petit Theft charge. During the intake process, the client learned the program rules and became familiar with the sanctions she would need to accomplish in order to successfully complete the program. Half way through the intake, the Case Manager completed a G.A.I.N Q assessment with the juvenile. It was determined from that assessment that the client displayed no major problems. The sanctions issued to the client by the law enforcement officer were 20 hours of community service. The Case Manager issued the following additional sanctions for the client: apology letter, retail theft packet, a 1,000 word essay, and mandatory attendance for all four group sessions. The client has successfully completed her apology letter and retail theft packet within three weeks of starting the program. The client also has been attending group sessions weekly. The client keeps the Case Manager updated weekly on her status and is scheduled to be successfully discharged from the program on October 13, 2011. Once the verification of the community service hours are received and essay is written, the Case Manager will close the case as successful.

JUVENILE DRUG COURT

Case Study

First Quarter 2011-2012

“Shane” was arrested on February 9, 2010 for Grand Theft and Dealing in Stolen Property. As a result, he was ordered to complete the Juvenile Drug Court Program as a condition of his probation. “Shane” completed his intake assessment on June 8, 2010. “Shane” admitted to experimentation with tobacco and marijuana. “Shane” first tried tobacco at the age of 12 and admitted to smoking “one cigarette in a week”. “Shane” admitted that his use of tobacco was “not very often”. “Shane” admitted he first tried marijuana at the age of 13 and admitted to smoking “two blunts a week” by himself when he does use. In addition, he disclosed during his intake assessment that he sometimes used substances to help deal with anger. “Shane” denied any family history of substance abuse. “Shane” scored a “0” on the Adolescent Alcohol Involvement Scale (AAIS), which placed him in the category of “Normal Adolescent: Total Abstainer” According to the Nelson Chart, “Shane” met criteria for Stage II, “Regular use.” On the Quality of Life Survey, “Shane” scored a “95” out of a total possible score of 100.

“Shane” lived at home with his parents and younger brother. This was “Shane’s” second time receiving counseling services. He previously completed family counseling through DISC Village, Inc Juvenile Outpatient with Mr. Luke Myers, as a condition of probation. “Shane” denied mental health issues and during his intake denied any current suicidal/homicidal thoughts.

Upon entering the Juvenile Drug Court program, “Shane” was attending Lincoln High School and was in the ninth grade. His grades and behavior while enrolled at Lincoln High School were not positive and his parents had spoken with his primary counselor many times to discuss alternative educational opportunities. His future goals included “to be an x-ray technician”.

Once an intake assessment was completed with “Shane” he then began working towards completing the program, participating in various treatment services including individual counseling, group counseling, Chemical Education courses as well as submitting urinalyses on an ongoing basis throughout the program. “Shane” began the program testing positive for

marijuana. Two weeks into his treatment, “Shane” began testing negative and non-dilute. “Shane” continued complying with the rules and expectations of Juvenile Drug Court until he tested positive for marijuana in August of 2010. “Shane” received court sanctions and a warning that if he tested positive again, he would be court ordered to residential. “Shane” began complying with program rules and testing negative and non-dilute. In December of 2010, “Shane” began testing positive for marijuana again and was court ordered to residential treatment. “Shane” completed his intake at A Recovery Center in Lake City, FL in January of 2011. While in treatment, “Shane” worked on dealing with triggers to use, coping with negative peer influence and improving his relationship with his parents while in family counseling. “Shane” completed his GED while he was in a treatment. “Shane” successfully completed A Recovery Center in July of 2011 and returned to the Juvenile Drug Court program in Phase III. “Shane” returned to the program with a positive attitude, a willingness to continue his sobriety and a desire to be a positive role model for other clients in the Juvenile Drug Court program. “Shane” completed all aspects of the Juvenile Drug Court program including attending all group and individual counseling sessions and testing negative and non-dilute for all scheduled urinalyses.

“Shane” progressed towards his goals, including demonstrating the ability to remain substance-free, working towards a successful completion of his GED and finding employment. At discharge, “Shane” was looking for employment, applying at Tallahassee Community College and was still living with his parents.

“Shane” graduated from the Juvenile Drug Court Program successfully on August 25, 2011.
