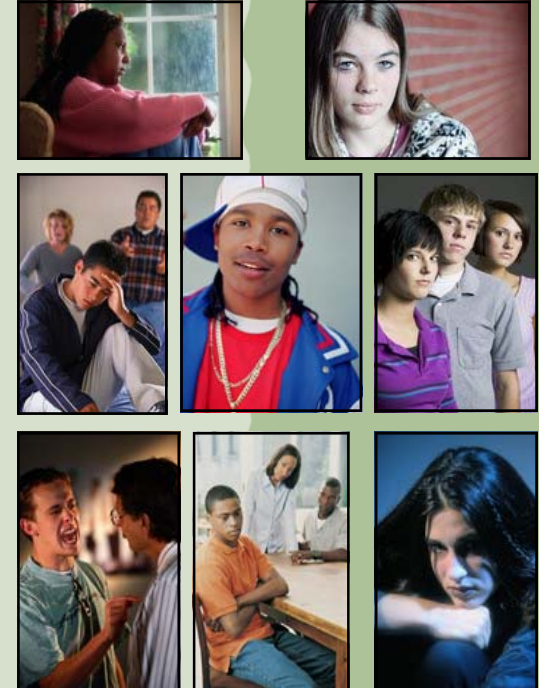

Who Are We?

The Juvenile Substance Abuse Outpatient Program is an integral part of the continuum of care offered by DISC Village, Inc. Specializing in the treatment of chemical use and abuse, we offer comprehensive outpatient and case management services to concerned individuals ages 10-18 and their families.

Outpatient services are provided by trained professionals experienced in assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of chemically abusing or dependent individuals and their families. We are committed to intervention, and quality treatment directed toward long term recovery. We also serve individuals who have co-occurring mental health disorders

Referrals

Should an individual be considered inappropriate for the outpatient component, a referral to a more suitable program or service will be provided to them.

Referrals for services may be made by adolescents, parents, schools, law enforcement or other community based service providers.

Our Services

Admission can be voluntary or court-ordered for adolescents seeking treatment for chemical abuse or related issues.

The initial consultation includes an assessment of the individual's and family's needs and suitability for intervention or outpatient treatment. Length of treatment is usually three months, but is based on the needs of the client and family. Services include:

- ✦ **Individual Counseling**
- ✦ **Family Counseling**
- ✦ **Case Management**
- ✦ **Chemical Education**
- ✦ **Urinalysis Testing**
- ✦ **Family Support Group**
